Next Book Discussion

A Choice between reading a non-fiction or a fiction book.

* The non-fiction option: Lynne Olson's Last Hope Island: Britain, Occupied Europe, and the Brotherhood That Helped Turn the Tide of War. For those who think they don't like history, give Lynne Olson a try: she has the gift of bringing history to life, and she doesn't focus on battles and dates. You'll weep when you read some of these stories: of the valiant young Polish men who flew with the RAF, for example. Here's an excerpt from the New York Times review of Last Hope Island:

“Olson argues an arresting new thesis: that the people of occupied Europe and the expatriate leaders did far more for their own liberation than historians and the public alike recognize. Books and films have dramatized individual stories of the resistance, but the scale of the organization she describes is breathtaking. Every captive nation built escape networks. The air war against Germany was sustained by as many as 7,000 British, American and other downed Allied servicemen saved from captivity by local people, directed to a safe house, given false papers and inconspicuous clothes, warned that it would be fatal to look the “wrong” way crossing the road and spirited back to base in Britain.”

* The fiction option: Georgette Heyer's The Grand Sophy. Stephen Fry says of Georgette Heyer (who published her novels in the 50s and beyond): “She is a fabulous, witty writer who captured the life and language of Regency England superbly.” For those of us who wish Jane Austen had written another score of books, Georgette Heyer is the answer . . . think Jane Austen with sexual innuendo! Of the (many) Heyer novels I have read, The Grand Sophy remains my favourite. Caution: don't start reading it on an evening when you want to go to bed early . . . it's a real page turner.

Munk Debate on American Democracy

Live Streamed at the University Club

October 12th at 7:00 pm to 9:00 pm

To better understand the issues shaping an extraordinary moment in U.S. politics, on **Thursday, October 12th** the Munk Debates will move the motion: **be it resolved, American democracy is in its worst crisis in a generation and Donald J. Trump is to blame.**

Arguing **for the resolution** will be the contributing editor at *New York* magazine, **Andrew Sullivan**. Heralded as "the most influential political writer of his generation" by the *New York Times*, Sullivan is former editor-in-chief of the *New Republic*. He will be joined by **E.J. Dionne**, a senior fellow at the Brookings Institution and a syndicated columnist for *The Washington Post*. He is recognized as "one of Washington's finest journalistic thinkers."

Speaking **against the resolution** will be **Newt Gingrich**, who has been called "the indispensable leader" by *The Washington Times*. He is a *New York Times* bestselling author, and *Time* magazine Man of the Year. Also speaking against the resolution will be **Kimberley Strassel**. Ms. Strassel is a journalist, author, political commentator and writes the influential "Potomac Watch" column for *The Wall Street Journal*.


