John Lennard "The Creative Process"



John Lennard is probably one of the few people anywhere that has performed with the worlds best in art, music and sports.

As a painter he is represented in Canada by the Roberts Gallery in Toronto and the Masters Gallery in Calgary, has exhibited in Europe and North America and was selected for the "Quiet Revolution In Canadian Art" Armory Show New York.

As a musician, he's been called "a sax player with power and drive to spare" by Canadian Composer, has performed in over 20 countries, recorded jazz albums in New York! Punk albums in London and received airplay around the world including feature coverage on the BBC.

Finally, as an athlete he has played squash at a world-class level both as a member of the Canadian team and as captain and number one player of the CSRA championship team.

Battle Lunch—April 21st

George MacDonell is one of the last surviving members of 'C' Force, a battle group of about 2000 soldiers that the Canadian Government sent to Hong Kong in 1941 to reinforce the British garrison in Hong Kong prior to an attack by the Japanese after Pearl Harbour. The British and Canadians were overwhelmed by the size of the Japanese attack and in spite of mounting a heroic defence, the battle was over in about three weeks. The survivors were made prisoners of war and forced to work as slave labourers by the Japanese. They were subjected to appalling treatment for the next four years with the result that many did not survive their ordeal.

George will be accompanied by Jonathon Reid whose father, John Reid, was a Toronto doctor who volunteered for military service and was assigned to 'C' Force as a medical officer. Jonathon has written a book about his father's war service, "The Captain was a Doctor", that is due to be published later this year. Johnathon will provide some historical background to the Battle of Hong Kong and George will give a first person account of a young soldiers' experience of battle and his subsequent captivity.
