



Published last year to critical acclaim and listed by the Hill Times as one of the Top 100 political or history books of the year



The renowned historian, Tim Cook, called Being Prime Minister 'a book that is wonderfully gossipy,' while Susan Delacourt of the Toronto Star wrote that 'very few Canadian political books would be classified as beach reads, but Being Prime Minister — about the private lives of Canadian prime ministers — is about the closest we may get this year to a breezy, summer read about politics in this country.'

J.D.M. Stewart has been teaching history at Bishop Strachan School since 2001. His writing has appeared in newspapers across Canada for more than twenty-five years, and some people will rightly note that he got his start by writing letters to the editor of The Globe and Mail, the first of which appeared in 1991. Two hundred letters later he is still contributing. In 2012 he was awarded a Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal for his contributions to history in Canada.




