



Topic: From Bay St. to Public Service, and Back Again

The world of public affairs is receiving more attention today than perhaps at any time within living memory. Many successful professionals give a good deal of thought to 'making a difference' in the broader world beyond their immediate firm responsibilities.

In the next of the University Club's continuing Legal Fireside Chats, three prominent lawyers who have practiced on Bay Street, moved to major public service positions on either the political or the civil service side, and in some cases moved back to private practice, will describe their experiences and the value of spending part of their careers 'on the other side'.

Paul Boniferro was a labour and employment lawyer and partner at McCarthy Tétrault, and part of the firms Senior Leadership team as National Leader, Practices and People. Prior to practising at McCarthy Tétrault Paul was a senior policy advisor to Ontario's Minister of Labour. In January 2018 he became Ontario's Deputy Attorney General, making him the most senior legal counsel in the Ontario public service.

Will McDowell is a prominent litigation lawyer and partner at Lenczner Slaght, with a focus on public law and commercial litigation. From 2005 to 2008, he acted as Canada's Associate Deputy Minister of Justice, with responsibility for civil litigation, national security and issues involving federal central agencies. He has taught trial advocacy at Queen's University and Osgoode Hall law schools, and is a Fellow of the American College of Trial Lawyers, in addition to being a member of the University Club.

Elder Marques is Senior Advisor to the Prime Minister, having moved to that role from his previous role as Chief of Staff to the Minister of Innovation, Science and Economic Development in September 2017. Before entering public service he was a litigation partner at McCarthy Tétrault. He clerked for the Chief Justice of Canada before his call to the bar.
