THE CLUBHOUSE

Steeped in history and rich in tradition, the University Club of Toronto is a welcoming retreat for the bon vivant — a place where Toronto's most inspiring minds gather, connect, and unwind in the heart of the city.

Housed inside a discreet Georgian building with rarely seen works from the Group of Seven adorning its walls, the clubhouse has been Toronto's best kept secret for over a century. Timeless and elegant, the building's façade resembles that of the Boodle's Club in London, England. Retaining the smaller scale of earlier buildings on University Avenue, the clubhouse is distinguished by its symmetry, stately second-storey Palladian window, and delicate ornamentation drawn from Greco-Roman motifs.

PRIVATE ART COLLECTION

With a deep appreciation for the arts woven into its very fabric, the University Club of Toronto has acquired one of the most comprehensive private collections of Canadian art in the country, including treasured works from each member of The Group of Seven, their contemporaries, and the Canadian Group of Painters that followed in the 1930's.



Lawren Harris was an early member of the University Club and it was he who originally arranged to have pieces painted by his contemporaries loaned to the club for hanging in the dining rooms and lounge. His sketches in the Lawren Harris Room evoke the stark simplicity and aura of mystery often found in Harris' work in the mid-twenties when he sought to express a sense of the timeless stability and the divine forces that he found in the Canadian North

All fees are subject to 13% HST.
Members save up to 10% by paying dues annually.
Residents over the age of 70 receive a \$3500 discount on their joining fee.
All members are required to pay an annual building fund capital fee in July in each year (~\$170-510).
Pre-authorized debit payments are required for all provisional (trial) members.
All rates are subject to change and reassessed annually.
Children and grandchildren of members receive a 50% discount on their joining fee.
Member privileges are automatically extended to a member's spouse without an additional fee.
A Resident member lives and/or works within 60km of the clubhouse.
A Partial Non-Resident member works in the GTA up to a maximum yearly average of two (2) days per week.
A Non-Resident member lives and works at least 60km from the clubhouse.
An Overseas member lives and works outside of North America.
Rotational membership is available for Association heads, NGOs and not-for-profits where the membership can be transferred to the new incumbent with a \$500 transfer fee.

THREE-MONTH TRIAL MEMBERSHIP

Curious about the Club? Take us for a test drive with a Three-Month Trial Membership! Trial membership fees are aligned with regular member dues, but include a \$25 credit toward Club use — including food & beverage, accommodations, and events. Trial membership includes all rights and privileges of full membership except the right to vote at club meetings. Provisional members can apply to become full members any time, at which point their joining fee is payable according to the membership type suited to them. Likewise, provisional members can terminate their temporary membership at any time.
